“Tomorrow Is Tomorrow’s Problem”

(Isaiah 26:3 God wants you to have perfect peace. We must be focused on the Lord through trusting in Him)

Perfect peace is not a state without any anxiety at all, or one where life is always easy and perfect God wants His Children to focus on trusting Him for the future. God advises against **excessive worry about tomorrow**, saying that each day has its own challenges and that He Himself will provide what is needed for His Children.

Matthew 6:34

(34) “So do not worry about tomorrow; for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own

Romans 8:28-32

(28) And we know [with great confidence] that God [who is deeply concerned about us] causes all things to work together [as a plan] for good for those who love God, to those who are called according to His plan and purpose.

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, to give you a future and a hope.

Predestination: God's foreknowledge and His intention to conform believers to the image of His Son, as mentioned in Romans 8:29. It underscores the assurance of salvation, as God's plan is unchangeable and certain.

He also called: In this passage the calling of God refers to the effective call to salvation, where God draws individuals to Himself. This is not merely an invitation but a powerful summons that results in a response of faith. In John 6:44, Jesus states that no one can come to Him unless the Father draws them, indicating the divine initiative in salvation. This calling is both personal and purposeful, leading to a transformed life in Christ.

When Jesus said "Be perfect, as your Father in heaven is perfect," he wasn't advocating for a flawless, sinless life. Instead, he was encouraging his followers to strive for moral and spiritual wholeness and maturity, reflecting God's character in their lives. The Greek word translated as "perfect" (**telos**) also means "complete" or "mature". This means striving to be fully developed in love, compassion, and a desire to live according to God's will

(31) What then shall we say to all these things? If God is for us, who can be [successful] against us?

(32) God didn't spare his own Son but handed him over [to death] for all of us. So he will also give us everything along with him.

(1) Think how much the Father loves us. He loves us so much that he lets us be called his children, as we truly are. But since the people of this world did not know who Christ is, they don't know who we are.

(2) Beloved, we are [even here and] now children of God, and it is not yet made clear what we will be [after His coming]. We know that when He comes and is revealed, we will [as His children] be like Him, because we will see Him just as He is [in all His glory].

(12) Blessed [**happy, spiritually prosperous, favored by God**] is the man who is steadfast under trial *and* perseveres when tempted; for when he has passed the test *and* been approved, he will receive the [**victor's**] crown of life which *the Lord* has promised to those who love Him.

Holman Christian Standard Bible

(12) **A man who endures trials is blessed, because when he passes the test he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love Him.**

(13) Let no one say when he is tempted, “I am being tempted by God” [**for temptation does not originate from God, but from our own flaws**]; for God cannot be tempted by [**what is**] evil, and He Himself tempts no one.

Christian Standard Bible

(13) No one undergoing a trial should say, “I am being tempted by God,” since God is not tempted by evil, and he himself doesn’t tempt anyone.

(14) But each one is tempted when he is dragged away, enticed *and* baited [**to commit sin**] by his own [**worldly**] desire (**lust, passion**).

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HALAK TO WALK

Paul, one of the first followers of Jesus, wrote that Christians should “*walk by faith*” (2 Corinthians 5:7, NASB). Most of us understand that “walk” in this verse is a metaphor for “to live” by faith. This makes sense when you understand that one of the Hebrew words for “walk” is *halak*. *Halak* means “the path you travel,” and more specifically refers to the way you apply Scripture to your life. The first believers understood that your *halak* was the most important part of your faith because the way you “walk,” or apply Scripture daily, directly influences the way you behave and think. Our spiritual transformation often starts on the outside by the things that we do and works its way inward to the way we think and feel.

Jesus’ *halak*, the way He taught and applied Scripture—was all about loving others. This is why He encouraged His followers with a “new commandment” to love each other. In fact, He said the world would know we are His followers by the way we love those around us, which requires us to care for, serve, encourage, and support each other. This is what it means to walk by faith.
