"The Monopoly Game"

(If Your Reality Is Not Christ's Reality, You're In A False/Different Reality)

The primary purpose of the Monopoly board game is to acquire as much wealth as possible through buying, developing, and renting out properties, ultimately aiming to bankrupt all other players. The game also teaches players about economics, strategy, and the consequences of accumulating wealth.

A "temporary reality like earth" refers to a situation or <u>period of time that is not permanent and is expected to eventually change or end.</u> It can be used to describe a state, a life stage, or even an entire worldview, depending on the context. Alternate Realities in Fiction: In fictional settings, particularly in science fiction and fantasy, a "temporary reality" might refer to a construct that simulates or alters reality for a specific purpose or duration.

Anything and Everything that takes you away from The Gospel of Jesus Christ and that He Is who He said/says He is, <u>IS</u> a different reality.

Diminished Reality: This refers to a reality where aspects are artificially removed or altered, such as through filters that reduce visibility. **Simulated Reality**: This is the concept that our reality might be a computer simulation or virtual environment.

Examples of some false realities: The Masons & Eastern stars, Yoga, Shriners, DeMolay International, Order of the Amaranth, Knights of Columbus. Yoga manifests itself as four major <u>paths</u>, namely <u>Karma Yoga</u>, <u>Bhakti Yoga</u>, <u>Rāja Yoga and Jñāna Yoga</u>. These four paths are like the branches of a tree or tributaries of a river. **Karma yoga** is a path to reach moksha (spiritual liberation) through work.

Bhakti Yoga: to engage in chanting or repeating mantras, which can be in a group setting (kirtan) or individually. Dedicating time to prayer and meditation, focusing on the Divine presence in your life.

Raja Yoga, also known as the "royal path" or "king of Yogas," is a classical form of yoga that focuses on mind and body control, ultimately leading to self-realization and spiritual liberation.

Jnana yoga is known as the path of self-knowledge or the yoga of knowledge.

Living a life of Sin Vicariously: Desiring to experience and enjoy a sinful lifestyle through false realities.

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The verse "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Corinthians 2:9) emphasizes that God's gifts and blessings for His people are far beyond human comprehension and imagination. This means that the rewards, joys, and experiences that believers will encounter in eternity are so profound and wonderful that they cannot be fully conceived or anticipated by the human mind.

Don't get sidetracked, this is Beyond Human Understanding: The verse highlights the limitations of human perception and intellect. Our minds, senses, and imaginations are simply not equipped to grasp the full extent of God's glory and blessings.

Divine Revelation: True understanding of God's preparation for believers comes through the revelation of the Holy Spirit, not through human reasoning or observation.

A Promise of Unimaginable Joy: The verse assures believers that their future with God will be filled with joy, love, and satisfaction beyond anything they can currently imagine.

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In the Bible, "<u>futile</u>" (often translated as "<u>vanity</u>" or "meaningless") describes something that is without purpose, empty, or lacking lasting significance. It refers to things that are temporary, offer no real reward, or ultimately achieve nothing. "<u>vanity</u>" (hevel in Hebrew, kenos in Greek) generally refers to **futility**, emptiness, or a lack of lasting significance. It emphasizes the

transient nature of earthly things and the need to seek purpose in something beyond worldly pursuits. The book of Ecclesiastes uses "vanity" extensively to illustrate the meaninglessness of life without a focus on God.

"transient nature" refers to the temporary and fleeting qualities of earthly life, material possessions, and even spiritual gifts in contrast to the eternal nature of God and His kingdom. It emphasizes that these earthly things are not permanent and will eventually pass away, prompting believers to focus on eternal truths and values.

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NECZER A TREE SHOOT

When writing about the coming Messiah, the prophet Isaiah wrote, "A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit" (Isaiah 11:1). The rabbis have always believed that this new "shoot" refers to the long-awaited Messiah, and Christians believe this verse points to Jesus because He was from the family line of Jesse. But there's another symbol here that I think a lot of us often miss when we read this verse.

You see, Jesus grew up in the town of Nazareth—a name that comes from the Hebrew root word netzer, meaning "shoot or branch." This is the word used by Isaiah. The word Nazareth basically means "shoots-ville." When the Bible refers to Jesus the Nazarene, the symbol is of Jesus the shoot—the One Isaiah had predicted generations before Jesus was born. Jesus from "Shootsville" fulfills Isaiah's prophecy.

I know many people who would argue that Jesus never claimed to be the Messiah, but, in fact, He did many times—in a very Jewish way that we often miss.
