Grace is God's kindness Towards Man, Not A Weakness For Mankind

"incomprehensible" in the Bible, particularly when referring to God, means that God's nature and essence are beyond the capacity of human understanding to fully grasp or comprehend

"God's essence" refers to the fundamental, core nature or being of God, encompassing His attributes and characteristics, which are often considered uncreated and beyond full human comprehension.

The nature of God is made up of many characteristics, including omnipotence, omniscience, and omnipresence. These attributes reflect the belief that God is all-powerful, all-knowing, and everywhere present. Other qualities of God's nature include love, grace, and justice.

Attributes of God's nature

Omnipotence: God is all-powerful and can do anything - Matthew 6:26-30, 10:29-30

Omniscience: God is all-knowing, having knowledge of past, present, future - Psalm 139- Isaiah 46:9-10

Omnipresence: God is present everywhere - 1 John 3:20

Immutability: God does not change He's the same "yesterday, today & forever" - Malachi 3:6 - Hebrews 13:8

Love: God is the essence of love and his love is eternal - 1 John 4:8

Grace: God extends grace and forgiveness to all who seek Him – Ephesians 1:7

Justice: God has a righteous anger against sin - Psalm 11:7, Isaiah 5:25, John 2:13-17, Matthew 21:12-13

"God's righteous anger" refers to God's just and holy response to sin and injustice, not a personal, vengeful emotion, but a demonstration of His character and COMMITMENT TO what is right.

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SHUV TO TURN BACK

Our English Bible often speaks of "repentance," which we usually define as regret or being sorry. But, the Hebrew word that is translated as repentance comes from the word shuv, which means, "to turn" or, more accurately, "to turn back."

Repentance is more than a feeling of guilt or regret—it is making a course correction in your life. It's deciding to turn away from where you are currently headed and turn back toward God. Imagine you're in your car headed toward a specific destination when you make a wrong turn. Your GPS says it's "redirecting," and then it asks you to make a U-turn. That is repentance. It's making a spiritual U-turn.

On a spiritual level, repentance is when a person changes the course of his or her life. As theologian Abraham Heschel puts it, "a change in man's conduct brings about a change in God's judgment." When we repent—turn away from the darkness and turn toward the light—God promises to take control of the wheel and direct us toward His light.

Do you need to repent—to turn back—today? Do you need to take a moment right now to turn around and face God?
